## Ongoing Health Screening Procedure & Infected Person Protocol

## **Daily Health Assessment:**

1. Verbal, daily health assessment: Ask the individual if they have any COVID-19 symptoms:

2. Once cleared, children will put his/her bags down and wash their hands in the outdoor sink. (Soap is provided.). Hand washing will happen throughout the day.

Staff follow the same procedures as above, daily, plus a temperature check.

\*A 14-day advance health screening is required for each child and instructor prior to his/her start.

## **Infected Person/Suspected Infected Person Protocol**

## If camper or staff is suspected to have COVID-19 based on this assessment:

- 1.) Ensure a face mask or buff is worn by individual, or ask the individual to put it on.
- 2.) Isolate individual by separating symptomatic individuals by at least 6 feet. (The area for individuals with symptoms will be at least 6 feet away from other areas.)
- 3.) Staff will wear an N95 mask or other face mask, and disposable gloves while working with individuals who have a suspected case of COVID-19.
- 4.) Notify management; parents/guardians to return home or for immediate pick-up; and appropriate healthcare providers (RIDOH) in accordance with guidance from local health officials, following organization's CDP (Communicable Disease Plan).
- 5.) Send child or staff member home for further evaluation
- 6.) If a fever of 100.4 or higher, child or staff member must stay home for 72 hours, as well as after the fever has been below 100 for at least 24 hours without medication.
- 7.) Consider if a child or staff member warrants further clinical evaluation. If so, help staff make arrangements to do so; or discuss with parents so that they know what must happen in order to return.
- 8.) Follow CDC Interim Guidance for Implementing Home Care of People Not Requiring Hospitalization for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)
- 9.) Clean & disinfect all highly touched surfaces, boats, bathrooms, and anything known to have been touched by the infected. If possible, wait 24 hours before disinfecting as per CDC Guidelines.
- 10.) When Cleaning & disinfecting areas from a potential case of COVID-19, ensure the best ventilation possible, don the appropriate PPE, clean, disinfect. Log all.
- 11.) Provide RIDOH with information to carry out "contact tracing" immediately to determine the potential or confirmed case's contacts with other children, staff, and/or other people on site over the previous two or more days.

\*CDC defines close contact as interactions within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes
