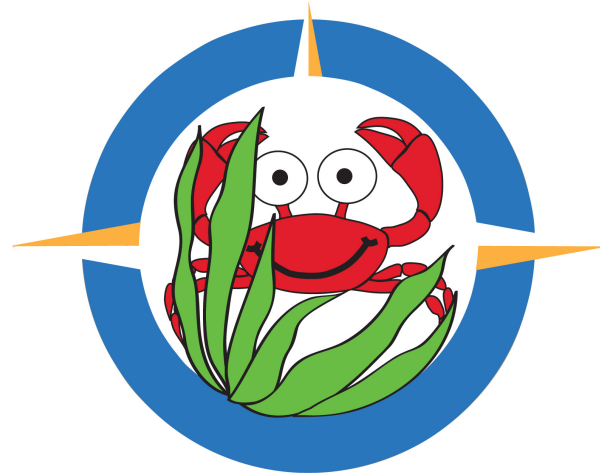

# 2021 COVID Rules & Procedures

## State Guidance:

- Pods of no more than 26. (We will have pods well shy of 26.)
- Each pod will have a specific separate drop off and pick up location – area A or B. This will be communicated in the email that you receive 1-2 weeks before camp starts.
- Pods will have specific home bases for the week
- Each pod will use the same equipment daily – nets, markers, etc....
- Each pod will have a designated port-o-potty that is cleaned thoroughly weekly and wiped down daily. (Port-o-potties are closed to the general public and only open to camp pods. Each unit is marked on the door for a specific pod.)
- Pods must remain 7' apart

# 2021 COVID Rules & Procedures, continued:

- Children will likely sail with the same children within their pod
- **Hand washing** – again, lots of hand washing this summer. 2 hand washing stations
- **Gate entry** – passes that we give out the first day
- **Drop off/pick up**: Parents are asked to stay in their cars for drop off & pick up as much as possible

# Masks

**June 1 – the State released this guidance about mask wearing:**

“Starting June 2, vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals will no longer be required to wear masks outdoors in Rhode Island. However, unvaccinated individuals are still strongly encouraged to wear masks in crowded outdoor settings or during activities that involve sustained close contact (less than 6 feet apart for more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period) with other people who are not fully vaccinated.

**The removal of this outdoor masking requirement applies to all ages and settings, including outdoor live performances, youth sports and summer camps.”**

As per the latest guidance about masks, **Instructors who are vaccinated will not wear a mask.**

**Children who are vaccinated will also not need to wear a mask.**

**Unvaccinated children will be asked to wear a mask unless they are distanced, outside.** For example, unvaccinated individuals should wear a mask: in a “crowded outdoor settings or during activities that involve sustained close contact (less than 6 feet apart for more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period)”.

**HOWEVER, children will not wear a mask when sailing as that would create a different, and potentially even more dangerous risk.**

# Concerns about mask wearing or not wearing:

**Mask wearing requirements are subject to change based on each pod** and any children who are not, or cannot be vaccinated, for health reasons.

Any parents who have unvaccinated children with compromised immune systems who are concerned about a lack of mask wearing are asked to contact Meg Myles to discuss the situation.

# Proof of Vaccination

Vaccinated children are required to show proof of vaccination before the start of camp. Proof may be a photo of the vaccination card email to Katie at: [office@jamestownssailing.org](mailto:office@jamestownssailing.org)

Vaccinated is defined as 14 days after receiving both shots.

# What to Bring

- Hat
- Sunscreen
- Raincoat (as needed)
- Towel
- T-shirt for tie-dye (Thursday's)
- Life Jacket
- Snack for half-day camps, lunch for full day camps
- Closed-toed shoes - water shoes, old sneakers, ...
- Sunglasses
- Change of clothes
- Swimsuit
- Layers: a sweatshirt/ jacket
- Re-usable Water Bottle
- \$3-5 for Del's on Friday's

- A water refill station will be provided but no cups are provided as we try to remain as environmentally conscious as possible.
- Sunscreen should be applied before campers arrive for the day. Instructors will remind kids to reapply sunscreen regularly throughout the course of the camp day.
- Campers should bring their own life jacket to camp if they have one. If you do not have a lifejacket to send with your camper, CISF will provide a lifejacket for their use during their week at camp. Life jackets are to be worn at all times when on a boat, on the water, on the pier, and on the docks.

# Swim Check

Ages 8-10 & 11-16 will have a quick swim check the first day

Marine Adventurers do not have a swim check



# Weather

We do our best not to cancel camp due to weather, but sometimes that is impossible.

Possibilities:

- Delay Start
- Early pick-up
- Cancellation

When? Heavy, extended downpours, thunderstorms (sometimes cancellation will be based on forecast of thunderstorms and our best, educated guess as to whether or not they will happen)
